View from the Hill

There were 52 crimes recorded on Winchmore Hill in March 2011

Only one burglary in a dwelling last month and 3 attempts. A ground floor flat was entered in Derwent Road, early afternoon, believed by an open ground floor door - cash and a mobile phone were taken. Believed attempted burglary late Saturday morning. Occupier in Houndsden Road heard a loud bang from the rear of the property. On investigating they found their rear patio window smashed. A victim confronted a suspect in Caversham Avenue in their front garden. The suspect pretended to be going door to door touting for gardening work. Victim later noticed a smashed pane of glass in his front door. Suspect is a white male, aged 25-30, facial hair, English accent wearing a white polo shirt and jeans. An attempt at night in Green End, the victim discovered jemmy / tool marks on their front door next morning. One non-residential burglary at Winchmore Hill School, where a large window was removed to enter premises and 30 laptop computers taken.

One robbery to report. 17yr old victim was

waiting for a bus in Aldermans Hill at 3pm when he was approached by 6 youths. He was subsequently searched and assaulted. 19 motor vehicle crimes. No real pattern with reference to locations, however numerous registration plates stolen. Following on from that, we only have one garage on our ward, Highfield service Station, who reported 4 theft of petrol offences. We had 5 vehicles stolen. A Vectra taken from Barrowell Green sometime over a 3 week period. Again over a 2 week period a Fiesta was taken from The Green N21. A Ford Ka was taken during the day in Hoppers Road. Another daytime was a Ford Van from Hillfield Park. One taken at night was a Mercedes 200 from Woodberry Ave. Other offences were one drugs offence, 6 assaults, 7 thefts, mainly shoplifting, and 3 criminal damages. One theft offence to be aware of is occurring at ATM machines. Please before you insert your card just be extra vigilant and make sure everything is in order with the machine itself. If not sure, please do not use.
