View From The Hill (VFTH)

Hello and welcome to April 2012 edition of VFTH.

There were 68 crimes recorded on Winchmore Hill Ward in March 2012.

Last month we had 5 residential, 4 attempted and no artifice burglaries. Letter box burglary in Arlow Road. Please, please don't leave car keys anywhere near the inside of your front door? First floor rear window forced late at night to gain entry to a property in Woodberry Avenue, where a quantity of jewellery taken. Can't say too much about this next one as enquiries ongoing. Thanks to alert neighbours and our own PCSO Wayne Maguire, arrests for a burglary in Stone Hall Road. Front ground floor window smashed and cash taken during hours of darkness from residence in Church Hill. Early morning through the front door in Grovelands Road, where photographic and electrical items taken. Attempts to enter were made in Carpenter Gdns, Woodland Way and 2

in Cranley Gdns. 5 personal robberies last month. Bourne Hill where an Asian male aged 21-25 suspected. One in Fords Grove, where a Southern European male involved. Another outside Sainsbury's at the bus stop where 2 males, one black and the other Southern European in appearance were concerned. 3 arrests for a robbery that occurred in Downes Court. Again enquiries continue for this one. Again suspect known for robbery occurring in Winchmore Hill School. This one being dealt with by our schools Officer for Winchmore Hill, PC White. Other crimes last month were:- 8 motor vehicle crimes, 6 where the vehicle was taken, 3 thefts of petrol; 1 snatch;13other thefts;4 assaults;2 drugs offences;3 criminal damages;4 frauds, 4 public order offences and 3 non residential burglaries.
