View from the Hill

There were 55 crimes recorded on Winchmore Hill in December 2010.

As expected in December a seasonal increase in the number of residential burglaries. There were nine with two attempts. In all cases property taken was either jewellery or electrical items or both. The front door to a flat in Burford Gardens was forced during daylight. Again a flat during daytime in Bourne Hill had a rear ground floor window forced. Another common method of entry was by forcing the rear ground floor patio doors. This occurred at properties in Farm Road, Hoppers Road, Gatward Close with an attempt in The Alders. All again during the day. The second attempted burglary occurred in Caversham Avenue at approx. 4.30pm. Two black males aged about 20yrs were seen trying to force a rear ground floor window. Rear first floor windows forced, access via flat roof in Woodland Way and Barrowell Green. One ground floor window forced in Hoppers Road.

Method unknown to enter premises in Oaklands. One good news story. A resident on Fernleigh Road answered the door to two males asking for someone called Ben. She thought this a bit suspicious and called police. Two males were subsequently arrested for a previous burglary. There were 3 non residential burglaries. 9 thefts from motor vehicles with 2 attempts, in the main, registration plates taken no hotspots. 2 stolen vehicles, both Mercedes and both recovered. 9 reported thefts, majority from Sainsburys. 3 reported handbag snatches. 1 personal robbery, victim was in their car stopped at a red light. Suspect opened passenger door and threatened victim. Mobile taken. 1 commercial robbery where victim was robbed of cash whilst on way to work. 9 other offences inc.drugs, assaults, criminal damage.
