### **View From The Hill (VFTH)**

Hello and welcome to July 2012 edition of VFTH. There were 50 crimes recorded on Winchmore Hill Ward in June 2012. Last month we had 5 residential, 1 attempt and 0 artifice burglaries. Entry gained to a flat in Lynwood Grove via smashing a ground floor window. The following 4 burglaries are linked. The first 3 by way of location, namely The Broadwalk. All 3 back onto Grovelands Park and all 3 entered via here. Forensics identified a suspect who has been detained.

Residents of The Broadwalk and surrounding streets may have had Crime Prevention leaflets posted through their door. These were kindly delivered by our Volunteer Cadet Corp.

An attempted burglary took place in Crothall Close. Winchmore Hill Ward has not had a burglary or attempt since 14th June.
