You said Speeding

We have run numerous speed gun operations around the ward.

We have liaised with the council and residents to identify and modify potentially dangerous junctions.

We conducted road safety operations with local primary schools and council road safety unit

You said Burglary

We have conducted crime prevention surveys for victims and their neighbours

We have worked with the local council on alley gating schemes for vulnerable streets

You said ATM Fraud

We conducted High Viz and plain clothes patrols in the area

We are working with the bank to identify offenders using CCTV

We are speaking to local residents to gather information about offenders and their vehicles

There were 63 Crimes recorded on Winchmore Hill ward in May. There were 11 Burglaries at dwellings spread across the ward. There were 2 non residential and 2 attempted burglaries. Two people were robbed in Laburnum Grove and Green Lanes. A delivery driver was robbed at a local petrol station and a large amount of cigarettes were stolen. There were 8 thefts from Motor vehicles and two vehicles were stolen during the month. The remainder of the crimes consisted of Making off without payment, shoplifting, pick pocketing and other thefts. Four people also received warnings for possession of Cannabis.

With warmer weather we have seen an increase in pick pocketing so please make sure your handbags are done up and your valuables are secure, a couple of people have been followed from ATM's so be aware of who is in the area.

The team and local authority carried out an operation, targeting "Blue Badge" misuse and two badges were seized, previous convictions have attracted fines of around £500.
