View From The Hill (VFTH)

Hello and welcome to June 2012 edition of VFTH. There were 61 crimes recorded on Winchmore Hill Ward in May 2012. Last month we had 12 residential, 1 attempt and 0 artifice burglaries. In Farm Road, a suspect described as a black male, aged 18-20yrs 5'7" wearing a blue jacket knocked on a front door. The victim was in bathroom at the time and unable to answer the door. The suspect then made his way to the rear and threw a rock thro' the ground floor window to gain entry. Victim then made their way downstairs to investigate the noise to be confronted by suspect holding a knife. Suspect then made his escape out of the rear of the premises. Enquiries continue. Entry gained in dwellings at the rear ground floor in the following, Cranley Gdns, Bourne hill. The following via the front, Wades Hill X2 (1 a letterbox Burglary), Hadley Way, Woodberry Ave.,Oaklands, Barrow Well Grn, Front door left open in Station Rd.

A suspect entered via a balcony to a flat in Bourne Hill. Through an open bathroom window in Lynwood Grove. A ramp, left by builders assisted a suspect in entering a 1st floor bathroom window in The Broadwalk. A personal robbery occurring in Winchmore Hill School. The suspect is known. Again pupils of Winchmore School are victims in a robbery o/s Sainsbury. Suspect described as black 15yr old male wearing a red hoodie and jogging bottoms. Last month there were also: - 14 motor vehicle crimes, 3 where the vehicle was taken, 8 thefts from the vehicle and 3 where it was damaged: 3 thefts of petrol;4 other thefts;3 assaults; 4 drugs offences;1 criminal damage;3 frauds; 2 public order offences;4 non residential burglaries (2 attempts);1 offensive weapon;2 telecom offences and 2 dangerous dog offences
