You said Speeding

We have run numerous speed gun operations around the ward.

We have liaised with the council and residents to identify and modify potentially dangerous junctions.

We conducted road safety operations with local primary schools and council road safety unit

You said Burglary

We have conducted crime prevention surveys for victims and their neighbours

We have worked with the local council on alley gating schemes for vulnerable streets

You said ATM Fraud

We conducted high visibility and plain clothes patrols in the area

We are working with the bank to identify offenders using CCTV

We are speaking to local residents to gather information about offenders and their vehicles

View from the Hill

There were 45 crimes recorded on Winchmore Hill in February. There were nine burglaries this month. The main property stolen was jewellery and electrical goods. Again as in previous months the main point of entry was at the rear of premises with either windows or doors being forced or just smashed. Please if you have side alleyways or gates giving access to the rear of your premises make sure that they are secure. If you would like some advice on how to do this, please contact us on the phone number or email address at the top. There were two robberies this month. One in Housden Road where a schoolboy had his portable music player stolen, and in Downes court a lady had her handbag and contents stolen. We have recently suffered an increase in devices being attached to local cash point machines. Devices either retain the card once inserted, or stop the money being dispensed. Please take care when using these machines. If your card is retained or cash is not dispensed,

ask someone to get a member of staff for you. If the bank is shut, contact the phone number which should be displayed on the machine, to cancel the card.

PCSO Tesh Velji will be leaving the team on 14th March to pursue a career as a police officer. I'm sure you will join me in wishing him the best for the future.
