### **View From The Hill (VFTH)**

Hello and welcome to May 2012 edition of VFTH. There were 60 crimes recorded on Winchmore Hill Ward in April 2012. Last month we had 12 residential, 0 attempted and 1 artifice burglaries. Possibly an avoidable one in Stratfield Pk Close. Alarm was not working, wheelie bins used to climb over rear fence and key left in rear UPVC door. Cash taken and suspects seen leaving venue, 3 white males in early twenties. This month I will concentrate on those crimes where we have suspect descriptions. Arundel Gdns: late afternoon 2 white males a/aged 20-25yrs East European in appearance have rung the front doorbell, which was not answered. They have then gained entry via rear ground floor window. Occupier was in and suspects have made good their escape. Brackendale: enquiries indicate a white male with an Irish accent a/aged 20yrs wearing a blue jacket and having a purple "LA fitness"

Suspect for an artifice burglary in Wilson Street was a white male a/aged 40-50yrs with English accent. He asked to check the water pressure in the kitchen; meanwhile his accomplice was taking property from the bedroom. Locations for other burglaries last month with the main point of entry being rear ground floor are ;Grovelands Road, Lakeside Rd, Woodberry Ave, Hoppers Rd.Hillfield Pk Rd. Almost out of space this month, therefore other crimes last month were:- 8 motor vehicle crimes, 2 where the vehicle was taken, 6 thefts of petrol; 2 personal robberies; 10 other thefts; 4 assaults; 4 drugs offences; 3 criminal damages; 4 frauds, 4 public order offences and 2 non residential burglaries.
