View From The Hill (VFTH)

Hello and welcome to October 2012 edition of VFTH. Or should I say welcome back following our 3 month break for Jubilee, Olympics, Notting Hill etc etc. Normal monthly service resumed unless we win a World Cup bid for 2022. There were 50 crimes recorded on Winchmore Hill Ward in September 2012. Last month we had 5 residential, 1 attempt and 0 artifice burglaries. The attempt occurred in Fox Lane, where the resident noticed jemmy marks on the rear conservatory doors. Again in Fox Lane, a ground floor flat, about 1pm, our suspect has smashed the bedroom window to open it and climb in. Suspect seen making off by the occupier. Only description is a white male about 5'4". Entry via the front door, during the hours of darkness, to a residence in Eaton Park Road. Unfortunately a number of items taken in this one, however a search of internet sale sites by the victim has led to a positive line of enquiry. One in Bourne Hill occurring whilst occupiers were on the school run.

Not to worry if you missed it email her at palmergreen.snt@met.police.uk Other crimes this month on the ward are 3 non-residential burglaries, 14 motor vehicle crimes, 1 where the vehicle was taken, 9 thefts from the vehicle and 4 where it was damaged: 2 thefts of petrol;7 other thefts;4 assaults; 1 public order offence 3 personal and 1 commercial robbery re a firearm seized.
