At our last Public consultation this year you told us what concerns you in Winchmore Hill.

You said Speeding

We have run numerous speed gun operations around the ward.

We have liaised with the council and residents to identify and modify potentially dangerous junctions.

We conducted road safety operations with local primary schools and council road safety unit

Two local residents have attended our single parade site in Lincoln Road and are now fully trained and will be taking part in our Road Watch operations in the near future.

You said Burglary

We have conducted crime prevention surveys for victims and their neighbours

We have worked with the local council on alley gating schemes for vulnerable streets

We are working hard to reduce the number of burglary offences in Enfield. We work with Enfield Council, landlords and other agencies to identify and tackle those areas and individuals responsible for causing anti-social behaviour. There were 53 Crimes recorded on Winchmore Hill ward in August. There were 4 residential burglaries with one attempt. Non-residential burglaries were 3 with one attempt. There was one robbery, where the elderly victim was robbed of her bag and contents. She was walking on Bourne Hill near the Junction with Caversham Avenue at about 3.30pm. A vehicle pulled up beside her, the passenger got out and hit her in the mouth, taking her property. Vehicle then made off. Numerous strong lines of enquiries are on going with this one. Surprisingly following events in other areas of London, in August there were no public order offences recorded in Winchmore Hill Ward. There were 3 recorded assaults. There were 2 drugs, one criminal damage and 5 theft offences. Two persons were arrested for possession of offensive weapons and one for going equipped. There were 4 fraud offences, mainly involving victims who had had their bank cards cloned. Again the main crime reported was that of vehicle crime. August figures slightly down on July. Total for August was 22 crimes comprising 12 Thefts from motor vehicle

3 criminal damages, 3 vehicles interfered with and 4 vehicles actually taken.

As we reported last month Sergeant Jim Collin has now completed his 3 peaks challenge. This involved climbing the highest peaks in Wales, England and Scotland and the cycle in between to get to them, not, as someone thought, cycling up them. For you statisticians 484miles cycled and 9843ft of vertical climb on foot.
